



Nova Warranty Announces Expanded Coverage Options Following BMW Electrical Component Recalls

The recalls, issued by BMW for 2023-2026 5-Series, 7-Series, i5, i7, M5, X4, X5, X6, and X7 models, involve air conditioning wiring harness issues and windshield seal problems that can lead to electrical faults and fire risks.

The expanded coverage addresses potential long-term reliability concerns that may arise after manufacturer recall repairs are completed. According to National Highway Traffic Safety Administration data, the affected vehicles include models manufactured between 2023 and 2026, with the air conditioning wiring harness vulnerable to damage during routine cabin filter replacement. A separate recall addresses windshield seals in 2026 X5, X6, X7, and X4 models where water intrusion can affect electronic control units.

"BMW owners recognize that manufacturer recalls address immediate safety concerns through specific repairs," stated a Nova Warranty spokesperson. "Our expanded coverage options provide protection for electrical systems, cooling components, and engine parts that may experience wear or failure beyond the scope of recall repairs."

The company offers two coverage tiers for BMW vehicles. The Nova Superior plan provides coverage for breakdowns and technical problems, including fuel pressure sensor failures in normally aspirated BMW models. The Nova Powertrain option covers engine, transmission, and electrical components.

Coverage extends to BMW 3 Series, 5 Series, 7 Series, i8, M5 E60, X6, and X7 models. The warranty plans address common issues including engine breakdowns, cooling system failures related to aging plastic components, oil leaks in vehicles five years or older, and battery safety terminal sensor problems that can affect starting systems.

For BMW M2 models, the coverage addresses cooling system components that utilize plastic fittings prone to brittleness over time. BMW E60 models receive coverage for engine-related issues ranging from fuel system components to transmission concerns.

The warranty provider reports that repairs are performed at ASE-certified facilities, with coverage including 24-hour roadside assistance for mechanical breakdowns.
